**Liturgy & Worship**

On November 27 English-speaking Catholics in the U.S. will begin using the New Translation of the Roman Missal at Mass. As we prepare for this change, we have a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the Mass and its importance. Fr. John will offer a short course (3 evenings) on Liturgy & Worship Tuesdays, Oct. 11, 18 & 25 from 7-8:30pm in the Parish Hall. Along with the reasons for the new translation, the course will cover: a) what is worship & why do we worship?, b) the origin and history of the Mass, and c) what we do at Mass and why. 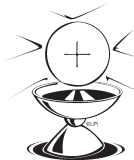

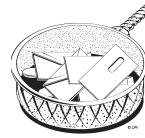
- Children's chewable ibuprofen and acetaminophen

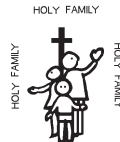
## Grand Annual Campaign
